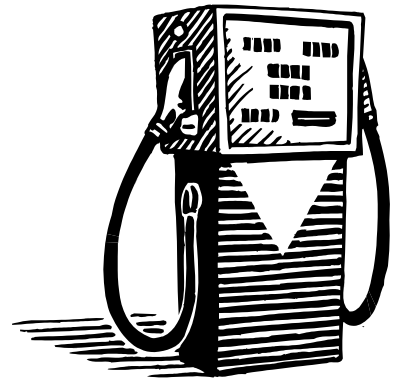
Wiley Homes Cruise

- 9. OPEN ALL WINDOWS**
- 10. VENTILATE FOR AT LEAST 5 MINUTES WITH THE BLOWER**
- 11. BOARD PASSENGERS ONCE ENGINES ARE RUNNING**

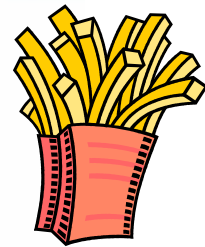
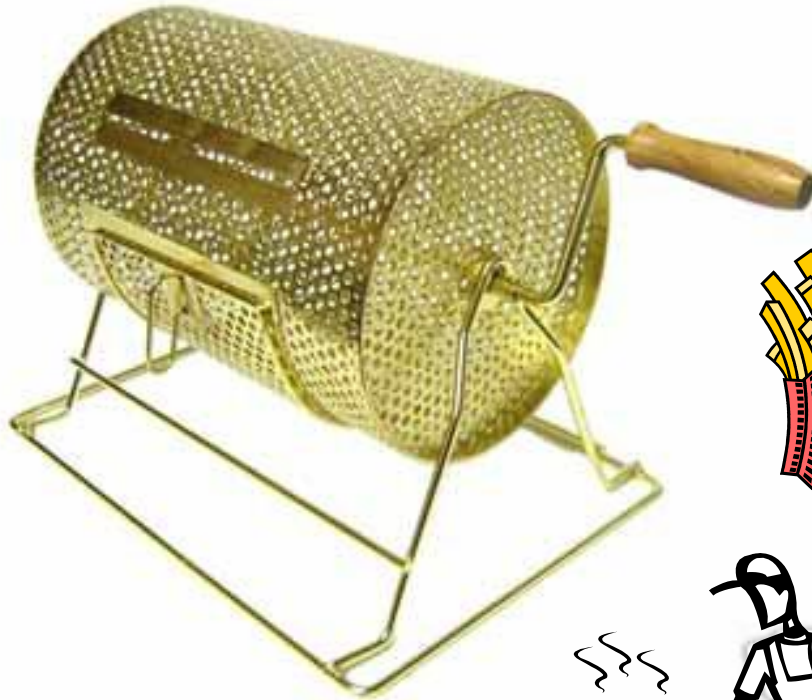

The Safety Helm

The Peak of the boating is now upon us and enjoyment of the waters and club is on everyone's mind. Sometimes however, we forget to do those things that are safety related. Some of the common statements include:

"I don't need a lifejacket, its nearby anyways, I can put it on if I think I need it"

"I don't need to follow the rules, they are for others to follow, I'm Okay"

"Accidents happen to other people, not me, I've never had an accident"

"I'm a Good Captain, I know what I am doing"

"I know how to put gas in my boat, I don't need someone to tell me that"

The bottom line is that no matter how good we think we are as Captains, sometimes things just happen. And they did not need to. This month we talk about the **GAS DOCK**, a great liability for the club. Each year, accidents during the fueling and pumping out process take place and could have been prevented. Taking a moment or two to protect the crew on board or the vessel or vessels around you, can save the club in liabilities, lives and property damage that can and will occur due to not following the guidelines posted at the GAS DOCK. Below is a brief reminder of the GAS DOCK procedures that must be followed.

FUELING DOCK RULES

SECURE BOAT, ALL PASSENGERS OFF

SHUT DOWN ALL ELECTRICAL DEVICES

NO SMOKING

DO NOT PUMP OUT WHILE FUELING

CLOSE ALL DOORS ,WINDOWS, HATCHES

CHECK FOR THE RIGHT FUELING PORT OR OPENING

START FUELING

SECURE TANK AND WIPE AND WASH OFF SPILLAGE

LEAVE ANY GAS SOAKED RAGS AT THE DOCK

OPEN ALL WINDOWS

VENTILATE FOR AT LEAST 5 MINUTES WITH THE BLOWER

BOARD PASSENGERS ONCE THE ENGINES ARE RUNNING
