The Safety Helm

This month we discuss Emergency procedures at home and what type of kit is needed to support you during a crisis. Every household should have an emergency plan in case of a local environmental emergency or a regional or nation emergency. This would include on where to go and where to meet to be able to survive and sustain an emergency at home.

When preparing for a possible emergency situation you should think about the basics: **fresh water, food, clean air and warmth.**

Water: one gallon of water per person for 3 days, (remember the hot water tank is also a source)

Food: at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food

Battery powered flashlight or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with extra batteries

First Aid Kit: this also includes several days of medications that are prescribed by your doctor

Whistle to signal for help

Dust Mask: to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to seal doors and windows

Moist toiettes garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation

Can opener for food

Local Maps

Additional Items to consider adding to an Emergency Supply Kit

Infant formula and diapers

Pet food and extra water for your pets

Important family documents such as insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof portable container

Cash or travelers check or change

First aid book or the Boy Scout Hand Book or information from WWW. Ready.GOV

Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person

Complete change of clothing including long sleeved shirts, long pants and study shoes

Household bleach and medicine dropper, 9 parts of water to on part bleach for water purification, do not use scented or bleach with added cleaners

Fire extinguisher

Matches in a waterproof container

Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items

Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils, paper towels

Paper and pencil

Books, games puzzles and other activities for children

Wintertime can sometimes leave us in the dark and unprepared, **BE READY** as disasters leave thousands unprepared as noted in recent times such as New Orleans.
