This month we discuss **YOUTH PROTECTION**.

Harbor View Yacht Club is slowly growing into a Family Club and rightfully so. **All of us** are responsible for training the replacement Fleet in the years to come and as such we should do our best to set the examples for the youth of the Fleet.

Youth should be wearing life jackets around the docks. If you are not sure of the rules concerning this, there is a posting of the Club's guidelines and policies concerning the age of youth and the wearing of life jackets on the docks and near the waterways. A drowning is a terribly sad and preventable event and all of us should take the lead in pointing out the safety issue concerning this.

Youth are not allowed to operate Golf Carts on the property. If you have a license to operate an automobile, you can drive a golf cart on the Club's Grounds. It is quite that simple. Again, the clubs polices concerning motorize vehicles are posted in the club house. Take time to read the Clubs polices and procedures.

**Youth at the BAR.** The Club has curfew hours concerning youth at the clubhouse late in the evening. Please review the policies concerning youth at the Bar or the hours that youth are allow to be in the club house late at night. Children do not make choices on their own. Guardians and Parents do. **Do the right thing.**

Children are watching what Adults do and will mimic what we do as adults. At times, Adults enjoy the fellowship of Adult Company and beverages and language. Sometimes this activity would not be suitable for children or youth under the age of 18. The Harbor View Yacht Club attempts to provide activities for our boating youth appropriate for their age group. Our children's safety and exposure to inappropriate activities should be at the fore front of our thoughts. Again, **Do the right thing.**

Protect our future generations in Boating. Make sure that they, our children will learn the ways of proper and safe boating and know and have a great environment to teach their children to be great Captains and Crew of the Harbor View Fleet. **Do the Right Thing.**
